Summary of Written Comments from Parents/Carers – January 2026

Parents/Carers were given the opportunity to provide comments on their questionnaires. The following is a summary of just a few of the written comments made and the school's response to them. Please Note - we do not publish comments made regarding individuals or personal situations.

Feedback from Parents/carers	Could FS1 children be included in more events, such as the Tea with Santa event the school?
School Comment	It is sometimes difficult to include FS1 children in all events. Due to the age of the children, sometimes the content isn't appropriate and requires more adults to meet ratio requirements, and particularly for after school events such as the Tea with Santa. However, we will take this on board, and there are plans to ensure FS1 children Santa visit in the future.

Feedback from Parents/carers	I believe that the criteria for granting term-time holidays must be transparent to ensure that no families feel they are being treated differently. Favouritism has no place in school policy, and I believe that work-related or single-parent circumstances should not result in inconsistent rules. The policy should be fair and equal for the entire school community.
School Comment	We assure parents/carers that we always try our upmost to ensure we deal with requests for absence fairly and within the framework and rules we are given by the <i>Department for Education</i> . We always try to be clear and transparent with parents when requests for absence are declined and we are always happy to meet with families individually to discuss this.

Feedback from Parents/carers	Is there any thought for breakfast club to start earlier as I know this will help myself and several other parents I know?
School Comment	We have previously committed to moving the Breakfast Club start to the earlier time of 7.30am, in line with our partner schools at Blidworth Oaks and Heathlands. However, despite numerous attempts since September 2025, we have so far been unsuccessful in recruiting personnel to enable us to do this. This is still our aim and we are endeavouring to do this now for September 2026.
